## CITY OF SHELLEY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

## SEPTEMBER 13, 2016

Mayor Pascoe opened the meeting at 7:40 p.m.

Jeff moved, Adam seconded to approve the following consent agenda: Minutes of August 23, 2016 Minutes of the Budget Hearing September 7, 2016

A roll call vote was taken: Earl - aye, Kim – aye, Jeff – aye, and Adam-aye. Approved unanimously.

Earl moved, Adam seconded to approve a Building Permit for Preston Kohler and to waive the fee since a flagpole was being installed as an Eagle Scout project. A roll call vote was taken: Kim – aye, Adam – aye, Jeff – aye, and Earl – aye. Approved unanimously.

Brent Christensen was in attendance to discuss his proposed subdivision, Sunset Vista. He said this subdivision is proposed to be located directly south of Basic American Foods. Sandy said the preliminary plat was approved in 2006 with the condition that Union Pacific Railroad gives approval to run the sewer line under the tracks. Mr. Christensen said originally the sewer line was going under the tracks, but it was difficult to deal with the railroad. He said there is a lift station designed to be located on the east side of the development now, pumping the wastewater to South Park. Mr. Christensen said nothing else has changed except the location of the lift station. He said originally he thought the council could just approve the subdivision without having another public hearing. He said he wants to begin with thirty lots in phase one. Dave said in regards to the lift station, EIRWWA rules do not allow grinder pumps to be installed in lift stations. He said the station will need to be designed and submitted for review. Dave said Fremont County has forty six lift stations, and have adjusted their ordinances to change the initial connection fees for those pumping to lift stations. BJ said Mr. Christensen is asking the Council to approve this plat and forgo the public hearing, but he is not sure the Council has the option to do this. BJ said the plat has changed

because of the sewer system and a lot has been added to the plat. He said it was also approved with the condition that the Railroad gives approval. BJ said he understands that he wants to start on this project, however he needs to make sure this is done right. Dave said moving a lift station is a significant change to the plat, due to the noise, odor, access, etc. He said they have a potential visibly impact. Jeff said he is concerned about being challenged on this. He feels it is a material change, and there should be another public hearing. Mayor Pascoe said the city should go with the attorney's recommendation. He said if the plat could be given to Sandy by tomorrow, she can send it to Dave for review so the public hearing could be called for in October.

Mayor Pascoe said he wants to talk about the property the city is purchasing. He said there is an issue; we have frontage in front of the Harlow property, and we also have another fifty feet behind the Gunder's property. He asked if the city wants an easement or a ROW in front of the Harlow property. Mr. Christensen said he has permission from Bingham County to put a roadway in up the side of the Gunder's property. The Council felt as long as the city has a fifty foot easement it should be fine.

Barbara Scott was not in attendance.

Ordinance 584 was presented amending Ordinance 579 in regards to the new sewer regulations. Ordinance 584 has the corrected sewer loading calculations. Earl moved, Kim seconded to suspend the reading of Ordinance 584 on three different days and to read the title of Ordinance 584 once. Approved unanimously. Earl read the title of Ordinance 584 in full. Earl moved, Kim seconded to adopt Ordinance 584 regarding the correction of the sewer loading calculations. A roll call vote was taken: Earl – aye, Adam – aye, Jeff – aye, and Kim – aye. Approved unanimously.

The David B. Bleak American Legion post has applied for an Itinerant Business License to use on Spud Day to sell hot dogs, hamburgers, etc. at the Broulim's Supermarket parking lot. The Kiwanis would not allow them to participate at the Spud Day food vendor area, since there is the same type of food being served by a different vendor. Adam moved, Kim seconded to approve the Itinerant Business License for the David B. Bleak American Legion Post. Approved unanimously.

## Scott arrived at 8:20 p.m.

Scott said the signups for Flag Football ended yesterday. He said there were about 190 registrations submitted. He said he has a couple of teams from Firth and Blackfoot. Scott said the on line registration went very well. He said there were no complaints from the public about the additional fees to sign up on line.

Scott said the pool is closed for the season. He said Rocky Mountain Boiler will be coming to the pool to inspect the boiler and shut it down for the winter.

Dave said there is an EECBG grant that may be able to help the city fund a new water tank. He said the grant applications are due by November 19, 2016. Dave said the water study is almost complete. He said he intends to submit it for Council Meeting –SEPTEMBER 13, 2016

council review at the next council meeting. Dave said in the study it recommends that the water storage tank on the Butte needs to be replaced. He said he will need to wrap up the study in order to pursue the grant on this project. Dave said the city will be competing for about a half of million dollars. He said if awarded, the city will need to hire a certified grant administrator which will cost about \$100,000, and it cannot be the engineer. Dave said ECIPDA or SICOG should be able to help. Dave said once the study is submitted for review, a public hearing must be help to adopt it. Sandy will advertise for a public hearing on October 11, 2016.

Justin said the seal coating, and scrub coating has been finished.

Justin discussed installing surveillance cameras at the city shop. Mayor Pascoe said they could purchase the equipment and install it themselves. The Mayor and Council commended Justin and the crew for the appearance of the streets.

Rod said First Lady Otter will be at the Shelley High School on Thursday at 1:30 p.m. to do a presentation. Kim and Mayor Pascoe said they have received a lot of compliments on Officer Swanson's and Magnum's presence at the High School.

Scott said the North Bingham County Library has asked if the City would donate a season's pass that families at the library could check out and use. He said it would be a onetime use per family per year. The Council agreed to pursue this and asked Sandy to place this matter on the next agenda.

Adam asked about the applications that have been received for Beth's job since she is retiring. Sandy said so far there are six or seven applications. Adam said they will try and begin interviews next week.

Jeff said he will be trying to get signatures for the petition to get the Recreation District on the ballot on Spud Day.

Mayor Pascoe said he appreciates everyone and all the help with Spud Day.
