CITY OF SHELLEY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

AUGUST 11, 2015

Mayor Pascoe called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

Kim moved, Earl seconded to approve the following consent agenda: Minutes of July 28, 2015

Building Permits:

Derrick Dye - shop Mike Curnutt - shed Erick Edwards - fence

A roll call vote was taken: Earl- aye, Kim – aye, Jeff – aye, and Adam-absent. Approved three in favor, one absent.

Kallie Brown addressed the Mayor and Council to discuss her Senior Project. She said she would like to replace the signs at the Curtis Brinkman Park with signs that are six feet high and five feet across that has the story of Curtis Brinkman embossed on it. She said the sign would be metal and black powder coated. Ms. Brown said she would like all of the public to know Curtis' story. The Council liked the design and concept of the signs. They gave permission to Ms. Brown to proceed. Ms. Brown said the total cost of the project is about \$800, and she is looking for donations to help her with this project.

Jake Roberts said he would like to request permission to access the city water system for Lot #3 in the Willow Estates Subdivision. He said they are just beginning construction of a home on this lot. He said the water has been laid in from the main line. The Council indicated that other people have been denied regarding water access that are outside of the city limits, however this subdivision was platted and approved to have city water many years ago. The Council approved access of city water to Lot #3 in the Willow Estates Subdivision. Sandy said the owner of the property would need to provide their own meter, pay the connection fees, and sign a water user agreement with consent to annex.

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Sandy presented the purceation and a narrative for the 20 Budget. She said this is the tentative budget which should be published giving notice of the Budget Hearing set for September 8, 2015. Sandy said all of the funds looked great this year, however the Street Fund, Street Light Fund, and Sewer Fund decreased in contingency. Sandy said the total proposed budget is \$9,779,993. (A copy of the tentative budget is attached). She presented a narrative discussing each fund individually with the proposed capital expenditures that will be presented again at the Budget Hearing, along with graphs. Jeff moved, Earl seconded to adopt the tentative budget for the City of Shelley for 2016 as presented, and to hold the budget hearing on September 8, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. Approved three in favor, Adam absent.

Sandy presented the Urban Renewal Tentative Budgets for 2016. She said there is a separate budget for each area. The Shelley Urban Renewal Area has been retired but still has ongoing projects. Sandy said the budget total for 2016 is \$727,719. Earl moved, Kim seconded to adopt the tentative budget for the Shelley Urban Renewal Area for 2016 as presented, and to hold the budget hearing on September 8, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. Approved three in favor, Adam absent.

Sandy presented the Country Club Road Urban Renewal Area Tentative Budget for 2016. She said the total budget is \$170,921 for 2016. Earl moved, Kim seconded to approve the Country Club Road Urban Renewal Area for 2016 as presented, and hold the budget hearing on September 8, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. Approved three in favor, Adam absent.

Adam arrived at 8:05 p.m.

Earl discussed the education that Rod has received since he was appointed as Police Chief. He said Rod is very approachable, and is passing his traits down to his officers. Earl said he has received an Executive Certificate which speaks very well of Shelley. He said he would like to keep Rod here; he said Rod is very marketable. He said it speaks well of Shelley to have someone in their ranks of his caliber. Earl said he would like to recommend Rod for an additional merit raise at this time. Mayor Pascoe said it is important to set an example and be a better chief as long as taxpayers are getting the benefit. He said there is money in the budget set aside for this and is not coming from the increase in taxes. Mayor Pascoe said that money is going directly into streets. Sandy said since there have been several entry level officers hired, it has made a difference in the amount being expended in payroll. Jeff commended Rod for the way he has worked with the new officers. Earl moved, Kim seconded to move Chief Rod Mohler to level twenty on the Department Head Payroll Scale effective October 1, 2015. Approved unanimously.

Dawn said she has been working on a manual that outlines her job duties and contacts. Kim suggested the manager at the pool each year take over all of the responsibilities and should not fall under the Recreation Director. The Council agreed, since the manager should feel ownership of the pool which allows more efficient handling. They agreed there should be a job description created for a Recreation Director, and a separate one for a Pool Manager. The Council Council Meeting –August 11, 2015

determined a Recreation Director would be hired full time Chandle the recreation programs and help in the general office duties. The wage base will begin at \$30,000 based on experience. Adam and Sandy will work on the job descriptions and advertisements.

Dawn said August 21st will be the first Grid Kid game. She said the city has started flag football registration.

Rod said now that summer is over and school is starting, the traffic will be increased. He said everyone should slow down and watch for children.

Adam said he feels the finances in the city are in good shape. He said there are "wants" that are taken care of, and we run a tight ship. He thanked Sandy for her work on the budget.

Kim said the Tree Committee meets on August 12th and will discuss the nominations for the "Yard of the Year". She said the winner will be announced in the newspaper.

Jeff said he needs to finish the Development Agreement with Golden Valley Natural. He said he will have BJ review the finished product.

Jeff said he is pleased with the budget. He said the streets are looking good and the taxpayers he has talked to understand the necessity of a tax increase.

Mayor Pascoe said he appreciates all of the Department Heads. He said the street signs that have been placed regarding the crosswalks are noticeable quite a ways down the street. He said he feels it will make people more aware of the crosswalk.

Earl moved, Adam seconded to adjourn into executive session pursuant to I.C. 74-206 (1) (f) regarding potential litigation. A roll call vote was taken: Adam – aye, Jeff – aye, Earl – aye, and Kim – aye. Approved unanimously.

Jeff moved, Earl seconded to reconvene into regular session. Approved unanimously.

During executive session potential litigation was discussed.
