Stacy moved, Jeff seconded to approve the following consent agenda:

Minutes of November 26, 2013 Council Meeting Building Permits: Rebecca Jolley - New Home Keri Payne - Sign

Roll Call Vote: Jeff - aye, Stacy - aye, Earl - aye, and Kurt aye. Approved unanimously.

Bryan Moore discussed the alley running from West Center to West Maple directly behind his property on Byron. He said a few years ago the alley was obstructed and the city decided to clear it and open it up so the public could use it. He said at that time an agreement was reached between the neighbors regarding the use of a gate to control the traffic. Mr. Moore said there are property owners that have changed, and there are problems being created. He said he would like to request the city to enforce the ordinance prohibiting the obstruction of an alley. The Council discussed this item that occurred two years ago, and it was determined then that the alley would be opened up. Sandy said Douglas Pfiefer sent an email stating he purchased the Wright home on West Center and was unaware an alley existed there. He said this alley is his driveway. Mr. Moore said two of the property owners need access to the alley to move their equipment to and from their back yards. He said it is more difficult to use the north end of the alley. Jeff said he felt the alley should be opened up and the gate should be removed. He said we have been maintaining this as an alley way. BJ said this alley is a public right-of-way and has never been vacated. He said there is no legal reason to close the alley. Chuck said there is a sewer line that runs down the alley to Center Street. The council instructed Sandy to send a letter to Mr. Pfiefer and Mrs. Jones, the property owners that have their driveways where the alley is, stating the alley must remain open at all times. The Council asked Chuck and Rod to visit with Mr. Pfiefer and Mrs. Jones personally about this matter. BJ stated the email was received from Douglas Pfiefer and was made a matter of record. The Council reviewed the email from Mr. Pfiefer.

Mayor Christensen opened the public hearing to consider the new Urban Renewal Plan. He turned the time over to Kathleen Lewis of SICOG. Kathleen said this URA Plan is being created to create financing for improvements in a geographical area. She said the Urban Renewal Area this Plan will dictate to is north of the Shelley Business Park and East of the New Sweden

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Highway. She said the hearing was published November 6, 2013, in the Shelley Pioneer. Kathleen said the proposed plan will be for a fifteen year period. She said the plan includes improvements to roads, landscaping, berming, irrigation ditching, etc. Kathleen said the Plan is in compliance with Idaho Code, and is to encourage growth. She said the new building in the area will help pay for the improvements. There were no public comments and the Mayor closed the hearing. Kathleen presented Ordinance #563 regarding the creation of the Urban Renewal Plan. Jeff moved, Kurt seconded to suspend the reading of Ordinance #563 on three different days and read the title of ordinance #563 once. Approved unanimously. Jeff read the title of Ordinance #563 in full. Jeff moved, Stacy seconded to adopt Ordinance #563 as presented adopting a Urban Renewal Plan. A roll call vote was taken: Jeff – aye, Stacy – aye, Kurt –aye, and Earl – aye. Approved unanimously.

Amy Goc addressed the Council to discuss the survey the city had completed regarding chickens within the city limits. Mayor Christensen said not all of the payment stubs were turned in, however there was no response from 293 citizens, 223 citizens said no, they did not want chickens in the city, and 150 said yes, they wanted to have chickens in the city. Jeff said there is a group strongly in favor of having chickens, a group strongly against, and some that just don't care. Mrs. Goc said she would like to pursue this matter. She asked how many residences there are in the city. Sandy said there are approximately 1350 bills sent out each month. Mrs. Goc suggested having a temporary ordinance for a year to allow chickens and see how it goes. She said she understands that there are irresponsible people, but the city is being unfair to those who are responsible. Stacy said he met with the Idaho Falls City Council a few weeks ago. He said when Idaho Falls first allowed chickens there were no problems. But now, chickens that are not laying anymore are getting dumped off in empty lots. Stacy said at this point if the majority doesn't want chickens, then they rule, however that could change in the future. Mrs. Goc asked the Council if she can get 300 signatures from city residents, if the Council will make a temporary ordinance allowing chickens. Jeff said he would not be in favor of making a temporary ordinance; if this is done it will not be temporary, and those wanting chickens would need a special use permit. Mrs. Goc asked the Council to hold a public hearing on this matter. BJ explained the purpose of a Public Hearing according to Idaho Code and what Public Hearings are used for. Mrs. Goc asked what the fine is for having chickens. Rod said it could be up to \$100 per day. Mrs. Goc said her personal property rights are being violated. Jeff said when you live in a city, you have zoning and other regulations to follow. He said he doesn't have anything against chickens, but the majority does not want them. Mrs. Goc said she is not done with this.

Stacy moved, Earl seconded to approve the license for Beer (Carry Out Only) and Wine (Carry Out Only) for Broulims for 2014. Approved unanimously.

Kurt moved, Stacy seconded to approve the General and Specialized Business Licenses that are attached for 2014. Approved unanimously.

Ordinance #564 to annex and rezone the proposed Fire Station Property was presented. Jeff moved, Stacy seconded to suspend the reading of Ordinance #564 on three different days and

read the title of ordinance #564 once. Approved unanimously. Jeff read the title of Ordinance #564 in full. Jeff moved, Stacy seconded to adopt Ordinance #564 as presented annexing in the proposed Fire Station property and zoning it as R1. A roll call vote was taken: Jeff – aye, Stacy – aye, Kurt –aye, and Earl – aye. Approved unanimously.

Ordinance #565 regarding the regulations of private driveways, easements, etc. was presented to the council for consideration. This ordinance would limit private driveways to servicing only one household. Stacy moved, Earl seconded to suspend the reading of Ordinance #565 on three different days and read the title of ordinance #565 once. Approved unanimously. Stacy read the title of Ordinance #565 in full. Stacy moved, Kurt seconded to adopt Ordinance #565 as presented regarding private driveways. A roll call vote was taken: Jeff – aye, Stacy – aye, Kurt –aye, and Earl – aye. Approved unanimously.

Earl moved, Stacy seconded to declare the following property as surplus property:

- 1. Small gray diamondback boys BMX style bike
- 2. Small black and green Huffy boys BMX style bike
- 3. Blue Huffy Rocket boy's bike
- 4. Gray Next Bella Vista men's bike
- 5. Raleigh gray boy's bike
- 6. Small pink girl's scooter

Approved unanimously. Rod intends to take these bikes that have been turned into the Police Department up to Bill's Cycle where they will be refurbished and give to the children that need them.

Sandy said the URA Board met and approved using URA funds to pay for looping the water line from approximately State Street to the New Sweden Highway. Jeff and Stacy said they would meet with Dave Noel on December 18<sup>th</sup> to walk the project and determine where the easements will be needed.

Dave Noel discussed the Sewer Facility Planning Study that is been done. He said the Council originally wanted to have the city crew camera the lines so that information would be included in the study. Dave said this is taking a while to get it done, due to the crew's schedule and equipment repairs. He said the study could be completed without that information, however it would be listed in the study that the video would be needed. Jeff said he just wants to see what our connection fee should be, and it we can get funding for projects through DEQ or Rural Development. Dave said we could wait until this time next year to request funding for any projects. He said applications were submitted in December. Dave said he held off on the environmental portion of the study because he didn't know what projects would be needed. He said he could do a capitalization analysis to come up with a connection fee if the council would like him to. He said this would develop a value for the current system. Stacy said by the time the videoing is done, the rest of the study will be out dated. Dave said no, it wouldn't be; from a regulatory stand point it would still be brand new. Chuck said half of the city has been videoed.

He said he just got a new pump for the sewer jet, which has to be done before they can video the line. Chuck said he cannot video this time of the year. Earl said he would like to see this study done right, which means including the videoing of the lines; he said the URA Board felt the same. Therefore, it was determined the crew should keep moving ahead with videoing the line, even if the study takes another year to complete.

Sandy said she received the new health insurance rates from Blue Cross. She said to switch to Blue Cross from Blue Shield in January would save the city approximately \$64,000 per year. Sandy said the benefits are fairly close; the co-pay is \$30 instead of \$20, the out of pocket is \$4000 instead of \$2000, and the prescriptions are about \$5 more. The Council said they felt this change should be pursued.

Dave Noel discussed the city's NPDES permit. He said EPA is working on the transfer of the permit to EIRWWA. He said this new permit includes monitoring for phosphorous. He said the get the phosphorous levels down to the level needed, there are several options. He said we can take the wastewater out of the river completely, can add a biological treatment train to treat for phosphorus and get it down to an acceptable level, or we can do both; reuse and treat. Dave said we could apply the water to a land application and discharge into the retired lagoon ponds. He said a new train/basin would cost less than a million dollars to add. Dave said this is a good opportunity for the city since they still own their ponds. He said option is the city could determine the percolation of the ponds, and it may be advantageous to EIRWWA to have a place to put the water in the winter. Dave said the city could use a groundwater recharge permit. Dave said EIRWWA needs to have something done by 2018 when the NPDES permit specifies. He suggested using the ponds and see how much water the ponds can actually hold. Dave said we could work with DEQ to close a portion of the pond. He said we could use the liner as a berm. He said we will need a temporary re-use permit from DEQ also. He said you can store Class A water in an unlined pond. Dave said EIRWWA needs a disposal system and the City of Shelley is able to provide that.

Rod said this past Saturday, Bingham County had a "Shop With A Cop" program. He said he participated and had a great time.

Rod said one of his department computers is down, and he will be getting bids to purchase new computers as well as a printer.

Rod presented the stats that were requested at the last meeting pertaining to animal complaints.

Jeff said the electricity went out last week which brought up some concerns regarding a major catastrophe. He said if the power is out for several days the city has no way to provide fire protection. Jeff said we should have a plan to obtain a generator to help the city in this type of situation. Chuck said a new generator which would be mobile is \$80,000 and a used one is about half that cost. Jeff said the city should have a long term plan to have access to a generator. Sandy will look into the budget and set up a line item to save for this equipment.

Stacy said the city looks great with all of the holiday lights. He also expressed his thanks to Sandy for the work she did on the health insurance.

All of the Council agreed that the city looks great with all of the holiday decorations and lights. They thanked all and wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

Mayor Christensen said he has mixed emotions regarding this meeting as being his last meeting he will be conducting. He gave thanks to all of the Council members and the appointed officials. He said this is his last hooray since January will be an abbreviated meeting for him. Mayor Christensen wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. He ended his dialogue with his customary quote of "Onward and Upward".
