Mayor Pascoe called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

Adam moved, Kim seconded to approve the following consent agenda:

A roll call vote was taken: Earl- aye, Kim – aye, Jeff – aye, and Adam-aye. Approved unanimously.

Sandy said the Methodist Church has requested that the park shelter fee of \$35 be waived. She said this fee has never been waived before. Jeff said there are a lot of church affiliated groups that use the parks. He said to be consistent, we need to charge the fee unless there is a special fund raising or other type event. The Council denied this request that the shelter fee be waived for the Methodist Church.

Dawn said she has applied for a grant to establish a Veterans Memorial at Hillcrest Cemetery, but was turned down. She said she has received a donation of \$100 for this Memorial and needs to hold the funds somehow. Dawn said she is receiving plans for the Memorial, and then there are people that want to solicit for donations for this cause. She said the Mayor's Youth Committee has been excited about this, and believe it will be able to be funded. Dawn asked if these funds should be run through the budget or have a Trust Account established. Sandy said in the past a Trust Fund has been established through the Bank of Commerce. She said the auditors have given approval to handle funds of this type that way. The Council chose to establish a Trust Account through the Bank of Commerce and have the Mayor, Earl, and Sandy as signers on this account.

Sandy said she sat on the Mayor's Regional Scholarship Committee Board. She said there were 38 applications submitted from Aberdeen, Firth, Blackfoot,

Shelley, Fort Hall, and Snake River High Schools, and 27 scholarships were awarded. Sandy said there were four Corporate Sponsors; Agri Service, Bingham Memorial, Les Schwab, and INL. She said the scholarships were mostly \$500 each, but there were a few \$1000 scholarships given also. Sandy said the total amount for scholarships given was \$15,000. Mayor Pascoe said there will be a Mayoral Ball on June 6th at the Blackfoot High School, and the scholarships will be awarded there; there were two recipients from Shelley High School.

Dawn said the pool is now open and baseball sign-ups will begin tomorrow.

Chuck said the flower pots were placed back on State Street today. He said the weeds along the sidewalks on State Street are terrible. Sandy was directed to send letters to all of the business owners along State Street to inform them that the weeds need to be cleaned up if there are any in front of their business.

Chuck said Mike Worlton has returned to work after recovering from back surgery.

Rod presented the Mayor and Council with a memo regarding the hours of sale for beer and wine in the city. He said the State code has changed, and we need to amend our ordinance. He asked the Mayor and Council to consider if they want to amend the language to prohibit the sale of beer and wine in the city on Memorial Day, and Thanksgiving, or if we want to allow sales on those days. He said the only day that is prohibited by the State is Christmas day. Rod said there are other amendments that need to be made to the code to comply with the changes in State code relating to the new Title 74, and we can make the amendment regarding beer and wine at the same time.

Adam asked Chuck to look at the condition of Ash Street.

Kim said the flower pots have been painted and cleaned up. She said Arbor Day has been changed to June 20, 2015. Kim said there will also some Eagle Scout Projects that will be done. She said one of the scouts is placing wood instead of foam in the flower pots to lessen the amount of dirt needed, and he will also be helping with the summer watering.

Kim presented a drawing of the landscaping that will be done on the new walk path on New Sweden Road. She said in regards to the Tree Inventory, Bill Harker said he would need at least \$3500 to \$3800 to do the Inventory. Kim said she felt it may be more beneficial financially to have the Tree Inventory done next year so the walk path can be completed this year. She said there are forty six trees that are proposed to be planted. The Mayor and Council felt the Tree Inventory should wait until next year. The Mayor and Council also are concerned that there are too many trees that are planned to be planted on the path. Chuck was directed to meet with Dayle Searle to review the plan further.

Kim said she feels it would be beneficial to put together a committee to look at establishing a future park. Jeff thought it is a good idea to have people that are involved in soccer, baseball, etc. to get together and give input regarding this

matter. He said he feels this needs to be driven by the public, and those directly affected.

Jeff said he would also like to set up a committee of individuals that may look at potential sites for development around the city. He said he attended a meeting and there were representatives that said there are a number of developers that are interested in our area. Jeff said he would like to get the Comprehensive Plan Committee involved in this as well. He said we need to have a comprehensive idea.

Mayor Pascoe said Governor Otter is looking for an area about 15 or 20 acres that could be established as a Veterans Cemetery. He said the Governor is looking on this side of the State.
