Mayor Pascoe opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Adam moved, Jeff seconded to approve the following consent agenda:

A roll call vote was taken: Earl – aye, Jeff – aye, Kim – aye, and Adam-aye.
Approved unanimously.

Phil Hayman introduced himself as the newly appointed EMS Fire Chief for the Northern District of Bingham County. He said he would like to make sure the Mayor and Council Members know they can contact him at any time. He said he is looking for volunteers, and will be seeking out individuals who may be willing to serve on the Shelley/Firth Quick Response Unit. Mr. Hayman said he is working with Chief Mohler and gave him the information on the Narcan Program. Mr. Hayman invited all to attend any of the training meetings that the EMS personnel will be holding. He said he wants to have an open line of communication with the community. Mayor Pascoe and the Council Members said they appreciate Mr. Hayman being in attendance and the information he gave tonight.

Commissioner Bair was not in attendance.

Scout Troy Johnson asked the Mayor and Council what is being done to insure safety in the schools. Mayor Pascoe said there is a School Resource Officer provided, and the School District locks many of the outside doors during operating hours. Kim said the School also runs drills for the children, as well as a police team. Mr. Johnson asked who is responsible for school safety. Mayor Pascoe said everyone is responsible; the students, teachers, police department, city officials, etc. Mr. Johnson asked what students can do to help. Mayor Pascoe

said a lot of time, a shooter that enters a school has been alienated in some way. He said the students can accept everyone and not bully others, etc. Kim said she appreciates the questions Mr. Johnson has asked the Mayor and council.

Kim moved Jeff seconded to approve the following business licenses for 2018:

Sandy said Dave Noel could not be in attendance tonight, however he wanted to report that he would be receiving a proposal from 3H Construction for testing the pump on Well #4. Also, he has two payouts for the Water Tank Project. The January payout for Dome Technologies is \$58,000, and the February payout is \$67,000. He said once the payouts are signed and the money is received, Dome Technologies will be paid.

Mikel said the Jazz Basketball Program is finished. He said Baseball registration is beginning.

Mikel said he has been working on the pool. He said the Aqua Zip parts will be here soon. Mikel said there were problems last year, and the company has revamped the equipment to make it better. He said the company is willing to pay the city for their time in helping fix the problem.

Justin said the hole has been dug at the water tank site, and the contractor is hoping to pour the foundation next week. He said the contractors are doing a really good job.

Justin said Dave is checking on what tests needs to be done on Well #1 so we can start using it again.

Adam said the annual Preparedness Fair is March 24, 2018, at the Shelley High School.

The letter from LTACH has been received regarding the grant for the Hawk Light that the city was awarded. The grant is in the amount of \$135,000. Sandy said the letter has been signed and send back to LTACH.

Earl presented a Certificate of Achievement that he received on behalf of the city from the Senior Citizens Center. He said he had the opportunity to review the improvement plans that the Senior Center is having done. Earl said it will be really nice when it has been completed.

Mayor Pascoe said he appreciates the community bonding together to help support the Hawk Light Project. He thanked Jeff for the positive and informative way he announce the awarding of the grant to the community.

Mayor Pascoe said he has received a few complaints regarding Golden Valley. He said management is going out of their way to resolve these issues. Mayor Pascoe said they are having some problems with their line freezing and it had to be thawed out. He said they have struggled with the trucking company that is hauling the waste water. Mayor Pascoe informed Golden Valley that it is great to have them in the community. He said he has also talked to the neighbors to try and resolve these issues.
