A roll call vote was taken: Jeff – aye, Leif – aye, Adam – aye, and Kim – aye. Approved unanimously.

Rhabir Roy - Orange Tag Fee Refund

Mr. Roy asked that the orange tag fees he was assessed in the amount of \$175 be refunded to him. He and his wife have several rental properties and they received an orange tag for seven of them. Mr. Roy said the accounts have been paid in full other than the \$25 orange tag fee. Sandy presented Mr. Roy's records for each of the accounts. The accounts have carried a balance since before 2019. Sandy said Mrs. Roy would carry a small balance to aid her in collecting the rent. The Council asked if they received notice before receiving an orange tag. Sandy said the balance shows on the billing, then around the 15th or so of the month delinquency letters are sent to everyone having a past due balance of \$5 or more. Then after ten days an orange tag is sent if the account has not been paid on or arrangements made by the owner. Kim moved, Jeff seconded to deny the request for a refund to the Roy's accounts. Approved unanimously.

Water and Wastewater Facility Planning Studies

Dave sent the final draft of each of the facility planning studies to the Mayor and Council for review. Adam moved, Kim seconded to accept the Water Facility Planning Study as presented by Forsgren Engineering. Approved unanimously. Adam moved, Kim seconded to accept the Wastewater Facility Planning Study as presented by Forsgren Engineering. Approved unanimously. Both studies will be submitted to DEQ for approval.

Ordinance #649/RE Zone Fence Setbacks

Ordinance 649 was presented to amend the setbacks and add additional language to section 10-8-5 (c) of the City Code. The setback change will apply only to an RE zone. Leif moved, Kim seconded to suspend the reading of Ordinance 649 on three different days and read the title of Ordinance 649 once. A roll call vote was taken: Adam — aye, Leif —aye, Kim — aye, and Jeff — aye. Approved unanimously. Leif read the title of Ordinance 649 in full. Leif moved, Kim seconded to adopt Ordinance 649 amending the regulations for fence setbacks in an RE zone. A roll call vote was taken: Leif — aye-, Adam — aye, Kim — aye, and Jeff — aye. Approved unanimously.

Liquor License

A Liquor License application was submitted by Idaho Mercantile Distillers dba WZMS at 480 N. State Street. Leif moved, Kim seconded to approve a Liquor License By the Drink and Retail Sales to Idaho Mercantile Distillers dba WZMS. Approved unanimously.

Damage to Fronger Fence

An email was received from Gary Fronger requesting reimbursement of \$514.29 for damage that was done to his fence during the Irrigation Ditch Project. Mayor Pascoe said he feels it need to be paid to the Frongers, then collect from the contractor. Kim moved, Jeff seconded to approve the reimbursement of \$514.29 to the Frongers and then bill the contractor. Approved unanimously.

Senior Citizen Parking Lot

Justin said he hasn't had time to look at the lot yet to see where the water and sewer lines might run. Leif moved, Adam seconded to table this matter until more information is obtained. Approved unanimously.

Certifications for Water and Wastewater License Holders

Justin said under our current wage policy the maximum number of employees that can hold water and wastewater certifications are limited to three. However, with the growth we have seen he would like to bump that number to five. Jeff moved, Adam seconded to change the wage policy to a total of five employees may hold and be paid for water and wastewater certifications. Approved unanimously.

Engineering Expense for ITD Grant Submittal

At the last council meeting the Mayor and Council approved the expense up to \$10,000 to Forsgren Engineering to submit a grant to ITD. This needs to be ratified. Leif moved, Adam seconded to ratify the approval of up to \$10,000 for engineering expense to submit a grant to ITD. Approved unanimously.

Department Head Reports

Sandy said she received an email from Sheri Cole regarding the cat problem in the city. Sandy presented the email to the Mayor and Council for review. The email outlined current and past problems and some proposals to take care of the problem. The Mayor and Council asked the Chief to check into housing for impounded cats and what a chip reader would cost.

Sandy said the Idaho Central Credit Union Ribbon Cutting Ceremony will be July 26, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.

Mikel said baseball is completed. He said he had some really good coaches and umpires this year. He said the pool is running great and Pam and the instructors are doing a great job. Kim thanked Mikel for the great job and read a letter of thanks from the Orange Pumpkins who was a T-ball team.

Jordon said all is going well. He said there may be some changes to the will serve letter that EIRSD will be giving out. He will be attending their next meeting.

Justin said the Movie in the Park on Thursday will be Top Gun/Maverick. He said the movie is being sponsored by ICCU.

Justin said the parts for the Hawk Light have been ordered.

Justin said Knife River is working on the Park's development bridge running to Lincoln.

Justin said the crew has been busy spraying weeds throughout the city. He said he will be working on the ones on Hanson. He said John Mecham passed his applicator certification.

Justin said the property owner on the north side of Bleak Park would like the city to pay for half of a vinyl fence running between his property and the city park. The property owner will be obtaining bids.

Justin said Bill Brabec from Rocky Mountain Power has expressed concern about the variance that was given to the Virginia Theater to build the addition to their building on the back of the theater into the setback. Bill said they cannot get their truck through the alley nor change the power pole if necessary. He said they voiced their concern on behalf of Rocky Mountain Power during the process. Leif will talk to the P&Z Commission regarding the criteria to issue variances.

Chad said the Police Department received 186 calls for services, they made 300 traffic stops with 62 citations issued and 23 arrests were made. The Council appreciates the Police making contact with the public.

Chad said the new cars were in Burley on July 5th. They are waiting for transport to Salt Lake City to have the equipment installed.

Chad said there will be a task force for summer aggressive driving July 23rd through August 8th.

Chad said they are working on hosting three trainings at the city building. He said this will help build relationships with the other agencies.

Council Reports

Jeff discussed the affordability of our city. He said the housing crisis is out pacing wages. He said people that are established are moving in and prices of homes and rent are increasing.

Kim said Gary Bates will be meeting with the Tree Committee President to begin planning Arbor Day.

Dave said they are designing the Child Pedestrian Project and they are about midway to completion.

Mayor Pascoe said people say how great the city's sports programs are because they are not too serious but they are more fun. He said he appreciates Mikel.

Mayor Pascoe said he talked to two Mayors that have passed an ordinance regarding day care and preschool due to some pending law suits. This ordinance will require the premises to be inspected by the State. He asked the Board members to think about this and see if we need to also create an ordinance. He thanked everyone and said everything is running great.
