Stacy moved, Kurt seconded to approve the following consent agenda:

Building Permits: None

Roll Call Vote: Jeff – aye, Stacy – aye, and Kurt aye. Approved three in favor, Earl absent.

Sid Page said when he was campaigning for office he heard a lot of thoughts from residents regarding chickens. He said he checked with some other cities, and some of the bigger cities allow chickens. Mr. Page said in Salt Lake City they allow up to fifteen chickens, and some are even allowed in multi-residential zones. He said even Blackfoot allows chickens. Mr. Page said he understood that about one third of the police calls are regarding animal control. He said he would like that number verified. Mr. Page said he was also told that there are no bad animals, just bad pet owners. He said some cities allow different animals according to size. Mr. Page said he would like the council to look at what it costs for animal control, and to consider allowing chickens with regulations in place. He presented a hand out that he drafted with his ideas for consideration. Mr. Page said the positive considerations for allowing chickens are the city recognition of citizens property rights, it teaches families self reliance, it teaches children responsibility, it is an economic benefit to families, and it provides healthier food for the family. He said he would like a committee formed that he would head up to look at what the costs are for animal control in the city. Mr. Page shared an ordinance that was drafted regarding keeping chickens in the city. Stacy said he went to a meeting with the City of Idaho Falls and they are having a problem with chickens in the city. He said the problem is, that some of the chickens quit laying, and then are being dropped off in empty lots, etc. Stacy said on December 10<sup>th</sup> the

only way chickens would be allowed is with a special use permit. He teels it becomes a private property right to the person who may be harmed in some manner by chickens also. Jeff asked Rod to find out how many barking dog complaints there are compared to dog at large complaints. He said depending on the outcome of the survey, he may like to see a committee formed.

Mike Carter, the Shelley/Firth Fire Chief addressed the Council to request the annexation and rezoning of the property where the proposed fire station will be constructed. This property is on the north side of West Fir and the west side of Hanson Avenue. The Fire District is requesting the property be zoned as R1 (Single Family Residential). A public hearing was held by the Planning and Zoning Commission on November 20, 2013, and the Board recommends approval of the rezone contingent upon annexation. Jeff said he has heard some concerns from residents since the proposed fire station is so close to the High School. Mike said they have studied this; looked at the traffic, the size of the highway, etc. and believe there will not be any problems. He said a representative from the rating bureau come into town, and his comments were that he liked the proposed area since it is located in the downtown area. Mike said there has been some concern regarding the side of the railroad tracks that it will be located on. He said however, it has to be on one side or the other. Mike said the students at the High School will be educated regarding the fire station and call outs through their assemblies. Stacy moved, Jeff seconded to approve the annexation of the property were the new fire station will be located on the west side of Hansen Avenue and zone the property as R1 (Single Family Residential). Approved three in favor, one absent.

BJ presented a draft to amend Title 10-8-6 (c) and (d) regarding private driveways and easements. The amendment will allow a private driveway or easement to one residential, commercial, etc. building. A private drive will not service more than one building. Sandy said Planning and Zoning held a public hearing regarding this matter and recommend approval of the amendment. Stacy moved, Kurt seconded to amend the ordinance in title 10-8-6 (c) and (d) to allow private driveways and easements that service one building only. Approved three in favor, one absent.

Jeff moved, Kurt seconded to approve a Beer License (Carry Out Only) for Shelley Exxon for 2014. Approved three in favor, one absent.

Kurt moved, Stacy seconded to approve a Cabaret (Dance) license for the Shelley Senior Citizens (Elite Retreat) for 2014 and to waive the \$75 fee. Approved three in favor, one absent.

election on November 5, 2013 are as follows: A total of 858 ballots were cast which is a 45.8% turn out for registered voters. Mayor – Terry Johnson – 292 votes, Stacy Pascoe – 554 votes. Council Seat #1 – Earl Beattie – 424 votes, Heather Goodworth – 407 votes. Council Seat #4 – Alan Dial – 268 votes, Sid Page – 225 votes, Sean Crystal – 22 votes, Kim Westergard – 317 votes.

Stacy said the needed easements for the water line loop between State Street and New Sweden have been obtained. He said now the engineers will need to review the location and design it. Stacy said Harper Leavitt is engineering the sewer, road, etc. on the Golden Valley project, and wondered if they should provide the design for the water line loop. Jeff said he felt it would be healthy for the city to use a different engineer from time to time. Mayor Christensen said he is concerned about duplicating services. He said if another engineer other than the city engineer designs a line that will be accepted by the city, the city engineer must review and okay the design. Mayor Christensen said Forsgren is our designated engineer, and different engineering companies do things differently. Jeff said this may not be the right project to hire another engineer to do then. He said it's not that we're turning out back on Forsgren, but feels it's healthy to dabble with other engineers that could potentially save the taxpayers money. Stacy said he understands what Jeff is saying where Harper Leavitt is doing the engineering for other infrastructure, and having them include the loop line in their entire project, however Forsgren will still need to review the design. Jeff said he recommends that the city move forward on this project and use Forsgren to design the loop line which should be saving the taxpayers money so services are not duplicated.

Dawn said she has approximately forty teams drafted for Jazz Basketball.

Dawn said she ordered the new piece of playground equipment for Pillsbury Park. She said the colors are purple, green, and orange, and will have several activity toys including one with an airplane.

Dawn said the Mayor's Youth Committee will be helping at the Tree Lighting and Chili Cook Off the day after Thanksgiving. She said for a service project they have been raking leafs at Goodsell School.

Chuck said the Christmas lights and decorations are ready for the Tree Lighting Ceremony. He said the new employee, Mike Worlton has started working. Mayor Christensen conveyed his thanks to Justin for the construction of the Merry Christmas sign.

Mayor Christensen reminded everyone about the Tree Lighting Ceremony and Chili Cook Off on Friday.


