Steve moved, Lorin seconded to approve the consent agenda as follows:

Approved unanimously.

A representative of Seasons West was not in attendance. Lorin said Seasons West might have some designs that could be used for a fountain at Centennial Park. He said he has had a hard time finding someone that could do this type of project. Rick said Holland Dredge gave him the name of the person that did the fountains on Utah Avenue in Idaho Falls. He said this gentleman should provide an estimate and design any day. Rick said the estimate should be around \$6000 to \$7000.

Marie Andreason and Doris Jones addressed the City Council to discuss the Economic Development Board. Mrs. Andreason said the Board is almost non-existent anymore with just Doris and herself being the last remaining members. She asked that the Council dissolve this Board due to lack of interest. Mrs. Andreason said there is approximately \$346.18 left in the Economic Development account, and they are willing to turn that over to the city, but they would like the city to use these funds to maintain the gazebo on the walking path. She said the city is doing a great job maintaining the walk path. Mrs. Andreason said she would go through some of the documents in the files of the Economic Development Committee and summarize what progress they have made during the past several years. She said she would turn the history over to Beth to see if some of the items can be used in the Shelley History Book. Mayor Christensen thanked Doris, her husband Jack, and Marie for all their dedication to the city.

Shirley, from the Shelley Pioneer asked if a master plan has been created for the Urban Renewal Agency. John said they obtained one bid for the plan, but other options are going to be looked at before any decision is made. He said the Urban Renewal Board would make a recommendation to the Council.

Sandy said she is working on the budget for the new fiscal year 2005-2006. She said she needs some direction so she can prepare the tentative budget for the work meeting on August 16, 2005. The Council directed her to proceed with a cost of living raise of 2.5% for the employees, raise the sewer rates by \$5 per month for a flat residential fee and the same percentage for all others, and to increase property taxes by 3% as allowed by law. Sandy said she received the quote from Blue Shield, and their premium was very close to Blue Cross. She said the city would save money by staying with Blue Cross. Sandy recommended that the city change plans which should save approximately \$10,000 and bring the increase down to about 22%. She said the plan would have a \$1500 deductible, with the city using the buy down program between \$500 and \$1500. Sandy said this would cost the employees a bit more, but would also save them on their dependant's premiums. She said Blue Cross will pay 80% on in network doctors and only 60% on out of network doctors with this new plan. The Council directed her to proceed with using this new plan in the budget. Sandy asked if the Mayor and Council intend to raise tap fees this year. She presented documents showing what other cities are charging. Lorin asked her to get the City of Ammon and Rexburg's rates. Sandy said she would get these rates and telephone poll everyone tomorrow.

Sandy said she receive some concerns about sanitation cans obstructing the sidewalks on garbage pick up day. She said Kay and Joann Gneiting are concerned about an elderly neighbor woman who walks daily with her walker for her health. They said that she has a hard time maneuvering around the sanitation cans. Sandy said they asked if the city could require the sanitation cans to be placed on the street near the curb. Mayor Christensen said he spoke with the Gneitings and they have approached their neighbors and are receiving co-operation from them about keeping their sanitation cans from obstructing the sidewalk. The Council did not feel the city should legislate anything regarding this matter at this time.

Sandy said she received a request from the Blackfoot/Bingham County Youth Coalition for \$800 to support their Americorp personnel. She said the program is greatly supported by the youth. Sandy said she has already expended \$800 this fiscal year for this purpose, but it was because the city was billed late last year, and it should have came out of the previous fiscal year. The Mayor and Council gave the approval to support this program by expending \$800.

Alan said since the truck ordinance was written prohibiting truck traffic on residential streets there has been some annexation. He said there are certain streets that are exempt from the ordinance because they are main thoroughfares for trucks. Alan said the ordinance should be amended to add Hansen Street, and South Emerson Avenue between Locust Street and Fir Street as exempt streets. Lorin moved, Steve seconded to have BJ prepare an ordinance to reflect this amendment. Approved unanimously.

BJ said the 7th District Bar Association holds a citizen law academy every year at no cost. He said this is held to increase public awareness of the law. BJ invited anyone interested to attend the academy on September 13, 2005, at the Bonneville County Courthouse. He said the meetings are held every Tuesday from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. for approximately ten weeks. BJ said he realized that the council would miss the academy on council meeting nights, but he did not think that would be a problem. He said he would obtain more information.

Sandy presented an Itinerant Business License that was not scheduled on the agenda. She said the license is for Nielsen Farms to sell fruit from a stand on North State. Lorin moved, Steve seconded to tentatively approve this itinerant license. Approved unanimously. Sandy said she would place this matter back on the agenda to be ratified.

Dawn said she noticed that the recycling bin that was in Hidden Treasure's parking lot has been moved to the street. She said this may become a hazard when the streets are plowed.

Dawn said the pool is holding its last session of swimming lessons. She said the school will be using the pool the first two weeks that school begins, and then she will be closing down the pool for the season.

Alan said more vandalism has occurred, so he has two police officers patrolling on bicycles. He said this seems to be working very well.

Rick said the progress on the new portion of the city shop is coming along very well. He said the insulating and sheet rocking are being done at the present. Lorin felt there should be more insulation in some of the walls. He said he would talk to the contractor about this matter.

Rick said there are some problems with the new lights on State Street. He said there are several lights out and the problem is not just the bulbs, but the entire light head. Rick said one was replaced recently and cost the city about \$600 for one light head. He said he is going to contact the Idaho Transportation Department about this matter and see what can be done.

Rick said all of the welcome signs for the city have been installed and they look great.

Charlotte complimented the city's appearance and the new city shop.

John recognized Chad Jensen who recently passed away for his contributions to the Goodfellows Drive each year.

John said he has been looking for some candidates for a new Tree Committee Chairman to fill the vacancy left by Tony Hill. Alan said there is a gentleman on South Emerson who is interested and will be contacting the Mayor.

Steve said Brandon Bird from the Bingham County Economic Development Council will be attending the next council meeting to discuss what development is happening in our area.

Lorin said Mayor Christensen does an excellent job for the city, and he would like to discuss this further in an executive session.

Mayor Christensen said Officer Stan Petersen and he went flying and took some aerial photos of the city. He presented the pictures for everyone to look at. Mayor Christensen said one picture would be hung in the new Mayor's Office, and the other in city hall.

Lorin moved, Steve seconded to adjourn into executives session to discuss the evaluation of a public officer. Approved unanimously.

Lorin moved, Steve seconded to reconvene into regular session. Approved unanimously.

Mayor Christensen said the evaluation of a public officer was discussed in executive session.
